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CAMPAIGN FINANCE GAINING SUPPORT IN NEW YORK, QUINNIPIAC UNIVERSITY POLL FINDS; VOTERS SPLIT LIKE A FRACKED ROCK ON GAS DRILLING

Support for public campaign financing for statewide offices and the State Legislature is growing in New York State as 46 percent of voters now support the idea, with 44 percent opposed, according to a Quinnipiac University poll released today.

Voters have opposed this idea in the past, including 52 – 38 percent opposed in a November 27 survey by the independent Quinnipiac (KWIN-uh-pe-ack) University.

Democrats support the idea 57 - 33 percent. Opposition is 58 - 31 percent among Republicans and 48 - 44 percent among independent voters.

New York State government is dysfunctional, voters say 55 – 38 percent. A total of 81 percent of voters say government corruption is a "very serious" or "somewhat serious" problem. The governor should have primary responsibility for cleaning up legislative corruption, 42 percent of voters say, while 41 percent say legislative leaders should have primary responsibility.

Only 37 percent of voters say New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo is doing an "excellent" or "good" job cleaning up corruption, while 51 percent say "not so good" or "poor."

Grades for legislative leaders are worse: 19 percent "excellent" or "good," and 71 percent "not so good" or "poor."

But New York State voters approve 48 - 34 percent of the way Gov. Cuomo is handling ethics in government and only 24 percent have read or heard anything about his decision to end the Moreland Commission which was investigating government corruption.

"An overwhelming majority of voters call government corruption a big New York problem," said Maurice Carroll, assistant director of the Quinnipiac University Poll. "But we're jaded: 56 percent of voters say New York is about as corrupt as other states."

"Some reformers think public financing of campaigns might help clean up corruption," Carroll added. "Support for that idea is up in the last six months.

"The people who focus on government ethics squawked when Gov. Andrew Cuomo killed the Moreland Commission that he appointed, but most voters weren't paying attention. Among the handful who knew about it, a big majority called the commission's demise a deal with the Legislature."

A small majority of New York State voters, 52 percent, prefer the coalition of Democrats and Republicans which currently controls the State Senate, while 26 percent want Democratic control and 18 percent want Republican control. The State Senate coalition is "effective government," 48 percent of voters say, while 33 percent call it a "power grab."

"New York's oddly split legislature, with a group of Democrats joining Republicans to control the Senate, doesn't please political purists but voters seem to like it," Carroll said. "Is it an effective way to run the Senate or a power grab? Most say 'effective.""

Natural Gas Drilling

New York State voters remain divided on drilling for natural gas in the Marcellus Shale, as 44 percent support drilling because of economic benefits and 45 percent oppose drilling because of environmental concerns.

Republicans support drilling 68 - 22 percent, with Democrats opposed 60 - 29 percent. Independent voters are divided, with 45 percent for drilling and 43 percent opposed. Upstate voters are divided 46 - 45 percent, with New York City voters opposed 47 - 39 percent and suburban voters in favor of drilling 48 - 41 percent.

Gov. Cuomo is "dragging his feet" to avoid a decision on hydro-fracking, 38 percent of voters say, while 23 percent say he is "carefully evaluating the issue."

"We should call it 'electoral fracking.' The contentious issue of natural gas drilling has divided New York State voters for more than a year," Carroll said.

From May 14 - 19, Quinnipiac University surveyed 1,129 New York State voters with a margin of error of ± 2.9 percentage points. Live interviewers call land lines and cell phones.
