## PUT POLICE BACK IN PROJECTS, NEW YORK CITY VOTERS SAY 2-1, QUINNIPIAC UNIVERSITY POLL FINDS; POLICE APPROVAL DROPS AS VOTERS WANT MORE COPS

The New York Police Department should resume patrols of public housing hallways, city voters say 59 - 30 percent, including 62 - 32 percent among black voters, according to a Quinnipiac University poll released today.

Support for the program where police "patrolled public housing projects and asked people in the hallways for ID" is 80 - 14 percent among Republicans, 57 - 33 percent among Democrats and 58 - 30 percent among independent voters.

Job approval of the New York Police Department drops from 68 - 24 percent in a March 18 survey by the independent Quinnipiac (KWIN-uh-pe-ack) University to 59 - 32 percent today. Approval is 54 - 35 percent among black voters and 71 - 20 percent among white voters, with a negative 41 - 55 percent approval rating among Hispanic voters.

New York City voters approve 57 - 19 percent of the job Police Commissioner William Bratton is doing, compared to 57 - 13 percent March 18. Approval today is 64 - 17 percent among black voters, 61 - 16 percent among white voters and 48 - 26 percent among Hispanic voters. Men approve 61 - 21 percent while women approve 53 - 18 percent.

"We can't ignore the likely impact of the highly-publicized murder of a child in a housing project elevator, but New Yorkers, black, white and Hispanic, say 2-1 that the police should resume patrols and ID checks in project hallways," said Quinnipiac University Poll Assistant Director Maurice Carroll.

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"In this case, at least in this emotional time, the civil liberties spokespeople are out of touch with the people they speak for," Carroll added. "Black voters agree with these spokespeople in their opposition to stop and frisk, but almost two-thirds of black voters want the police back in the public housing projects, checking people in the hallways."

New York City voters support 75 - 18 percent a proposal to hire 1,000 additional police officers, with support at 70 percent or higher among all party, gender and ethnic groups.

Voters believe 48 - 42 percent that Mayor Bill de Blasio can reduce stop and frisk and still make the city safer. Black voters, 63 - 24 percent, and Hispanic voters, 59 - 37 percent agree that the mayor can reduce stop and frisk and keep the city safe. White voters say 55 - 37 percent that crime will go up.

Voters approve 51 - 39 percent of the police practice of recruiting potential informants among Muslims and members of other minority groups who get arrested. Approval is 63 - 28percent among white voters and 46 - 41 percent among Hispanic voters. Black voters disapprove 54 - 35 percent.

"Stop and frisk persists as a divisive issue. Will ending it drive up crime? Black and Hispanic voters say no, but white voters say yes," Carroll said.

#### Minimum Wage

The minimum wage in New York City should be raised to \$13 per hour, 50 percent of voters say, while 35 percent say raise it to \$10.10 per hour. Another 11 percent say the \$8 per hour minimum wage should not be raised.

Among Democrats, 61 percent want \$13 per hour and 33 percent want \$10.10.

Among Republicans, 34 percent want \$13 and 35 percent want \$10.10.

Among independent voters 40 percent want \$13 and 42 percent want \$10.10.

From June 5 – 9, Quinnipiac University surveyed 1,033 New York City voters, with a margin of error of +/-3.1 percentage points. Live interviewers call land lines and cell phones.
