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NEW YORKERS WELCOME DEM CONVENTION 3-1, QUINNIPIAC UNIVERSITY POLL FINDS; VOTERS WANT RIGHT TO RENT ROOMS LIKE A HOTEL

By a 66 - 23 percent margin, New York City voters want to host the 2016 Democratic National Convention, according to a Quinnipiac University poll released today. Welcoming the convention are Democrats 78 - 14 percent and independent voters 60 - 27 percent, while Republican voters say no 52 - 38 percent.

By a small 47 – 39 percent margin, with a split among the boroughs, voters prefer Brooklyn over Manhattan as the site for the convention, the independent Quinnipiac (KWIN-uhpe-ack) University poll finds.

Brooklyn voters say 54 - 35 percent YIMBY – yes in my backyard – and Manhattan voters agree 53 - 31 percent that the convention should be in Brooklyn. Queens voters are divided with 42 percent for Brooklyn and 40 percent for Manhattan. Backing Manhattan over Brooklyn are Staten Island voters 55 - 31 percent, with 50 percent of Bronx voters agreeing.

All New York City voters agree 67 – 22 percent that Brooklyn is the new "hip place."

Support for a hip Brooklyn ranges from 49 - 32 percent in The Bronx to 85 - 12 percent in Brooklyn. Even voters over 65 years old say 64 - 19 percent that Brooklyn is hip.

If Mayor Bill de Blasio is seen as a national spokesman for liberal issues, that's good for New York City, voters say 30 - 17 percent, while 46 percent say it makes no difference.

A role as spokesman on liberal issues is good for de Blasio, voters say 44 - 12 percent.

"Hey! Let's have a party! By 3-1, New Yorkers would like to play host to the

Democratic National Convention in 2016," said Quinnipiac University Poll Assistant Director Maurice Carroll. "Being host would boost Mayor Bill de Blasio's national renown, and many New Yorkers like the idea that their mayor is turning into a national spokesman for liberalism. Good for the city, good for him, they say."

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"Haven't you heard? Brooklyn is now hip! The city's pitch is to stage the show in Brooklyn – and Brooklyn likes that a lot," Carroll added. "Manhattanites think the convention ought to be in Brooklyn, too. Are they being gracious, or ducking the traffic?"

Turning Apartments into Hotels

New York City voters support 56 - 36 percent allowing people to rent rooms in their homes to strangers, similar to a hotel. Support is similar among men, women, black voters and white voters, while Hispanic voters are divided, with 46 percent in favor and 45 percent opposed.

Manhattan voters favor the right to rent 61 - 32 percent, followed by Queens at 60 - 29 percent, and Brooklyn at 57 - 34 percent. Staten Island voters are divided with 46 percent in favor and 49 percent opposed, and 50 percent of Bronx voters say the practice should be banned, while 42 percent support it.

Poor Doors and Carriage Horses

Moving homeless families into public housing is a good idea, New York City voters say 76 – 15 percent.

Outlaw the "poor door," voters say 78 - 17 percent and require luxury housing developers who include affordable housing to provide one entrance for everyone. Support for one entrance ranges from 60 - 33 percent among Republicans to 83 - 13 percent among Democrats.

Mayor de Blasio should <u>not</u> ban horse-drawn carriages, voters say 61 - 25 percent. There is no party, gender, age, race or borough group in favor of the ban. Opposition to the ban tops 2-1 for the fourth Quinnipiac University poll in a row.

"New Yorkers want the right to turn their apartments into hotels," Carroll said. "Folks in The Bronx and Staten Island are less excited with the idea.

"On another issue, voters want to slam shut the so-called 'Poor Door,' allowing rich and not-so-rich to use the same entrance.

"In case you forgot, that idea of banning carriage horses is still around. And New Yorkers still think it's a bad idea."

From August 20 - 25, Quinnipiac University surveyed 1,021 New York City voters, with a margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points. Live interviewers call land lines and cell phones.
