MORE AMERICANS SAY CHURCH IS GOING THEIR WAY, QUINNIPIAC UNIVERSITY NATIONAL POLL FINDS

Americans like Pope Francis as 18 percent have a "very favorable" opinion of him and 48 percent have a "favorable" opinion, with 10 percent "unfavorable" and 4 percent "very unfavorable," according to a Quinnipiac University National poll released today.

A total of 69 percent of women, 63 percent of men, 61 percent of Protestants, 87 percent of Catholics and 63 percent with no religion have a "very favorable" or "favorable" opinion, the independent Quinnipiac (KWIN-uh-pe-ack) University poll finds.

The Catholic Church of today is moving in the right direction, Americans say 43 - 21 percent. Catholics say "right direction" 70 - 16 percent, compared to 36 - 24 percent among Protestants and 44 - 22 percent among those with no religion.

The gender gap widens as Catholics say 52 - 38 percent that Catholic Church leaders are in touch with the views of Catholics in America today. Women say 57 - 34 percent that Church leaders are in touch. Men are divided 47 - 44 percent.

"Pope Francis is sparking a resurgent confidence in the Catholic Church as more Catholics, Protestants and those with no religion believe the Vatican is steering The Church in the right direction," said Tim Malloy, assistant director of the Quinnipiac University Poll.

From August 20 - 25, Quinnipiac University surveyed 1,829 American adults with a margin of error of +/- 2.3 percentage points. The survey includes 424 Catholics with a margin of error of +/- 4.8 percentage points. Live interviewers call land lines and cell phones.

The Quinnipiac University Poll, directed by Douglas Schwartz, Ph.D., conducts public opinion surveys in Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Florida, Ohio, Virginia, Iowa, Colorado and the nation as a public service and for research.
